What is inclusion?

The Division for Early Childhood (DEC) and the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) define early childhood inclusion as "the values, policies, and practices that support the right of every infant and young child and his or her family, regardless of ability, to participate in a broad range of activities and contexts as full members of families, communities, and society."

What is an Inclusion Enhancement Kit (IEK)?

An IEK contains many of the tools and supplies a childcare provider needs to create an inclusive environment where <u>all</u> children can learn and grow.

How do I get an IEK for my program?
